Pupil Premium***

Pupil Premium is funding that we receive from the Government. It is additional to our main school funding and is used to address potential underlying inequalities between forces children and those who are eligible for free school meals (FSM) and their peers, by making sure that this extra funding reaches the children who need it most.

Ruskington Chestnut Street Church of England primary receives a Pupil Premium Grant for each child who is entitled to receive Free School Meals (FSM) or who has been entitled over the last five years, for any Looked After Children and pupils who have parents that are in the Armed Forces.

We are required to publish online information about how we have used the premium.

For 2014-15 the School received £76,899.
