How you can support your child at home

Please note the most important homework you can be doing with your child is reading. Reading to them, listening to them reading, talking about stories, using the internet to find out answers to their questions. We encourage parents to read to children throughout their time at primary school so that they can learn to enjoy books with someone else.

Please encourage your child to read as much as possible. This does not need to be just the books that we send home but could be newspapers, instructions, recipes, art and craft instructions etc. The more children read the more vocabulary they hear and develop and can use in their own writing.

We will not be sending spellings home weekly. However children will have a spelling/phonics lesson each day and be practising in class. They will be bringing home the spelling rule they have been taught or personalised spellings from the 100 or 200 spelling list.

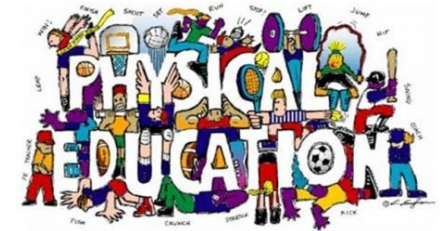
